AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 15 TO TITLE XIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO CREATE A GUAM PLACE NAME COMMISSION.

1,	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. A new Chapter 15 is hereby added to Title
3	XIV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:
4	"CHAPTER 15
5	GUAM PLACE NAME COMMISSION
6	Section 13999. Definitions:
7	(a) Commission means the Guam Place Name
8	Commission.
9	(b) A 'place name' is an official name given
10	to places in the territory of Guam by the Commission.
11	(c) A 'place' is a site, geographic feature,
12	area, or district bearing or capable of bearing
13	a single name for descriptive and other purposes.
14	(d) Executive Director means the Director
15	of the Department of Land Management.
16	Section 13999.1. Guam Place Name Commission. The
17	Territorial Planning Commission shall be the Guam Place Name
18	Commission,
19	Section 13999.2. Powers of the Commission. The
20	Commission shall be authorized to:
21	(a) Establish place names for all places
22	within the jurisdiction of the government of Guam,
23	on the basis of the following: Historical and cultura
24	background; community usage; and suitability.
25	(b) Prepare and promulgate regulations, pursuant
26	to the Administrative Adjudication Act, establishing
27	the methods by which it shall exercise its powers .
28	herein.
29	(c) Cooperate with the Department of Education,
30	the University of Guam, the Guam Museum, and civic

and religious clubs and organizations interested in the program of providing appropriate place names for Guam, in drafting and using a coherent, culturally sound, and historically accurate set of criteria for selecting place names;

- (d) Change any place name previously given to or used for any place within Guam when such place name is inappropriate, unhistorical, confusing, or otherwise unsuitable in the light of the criteria established for territorial place names.
- (e) Utilize to the maximum extent feasible Chamorro words in selecting place names with a view toward: preserving the use of Chamorro and maintaining the Chamorro designation for places in Guam; provided, however, that in addition to preserving Chamorro place names in current usage, the Commission shall utilize Chamorro in naming new places not now bearing place names.
- (f) Restore to the maximum extent feasible the ancient Chamorro spellings and pronunciations to place names now mispelled and mispronounced.

Section 13999.3. Future place names. No person or agency of government may give any name to any place within Guam without the approval and concurrence of the Commission.

Section 13999.4. Commission Staff Personnel. The Executive Director shall perform such services and exercise such, powers as may be prescribed by the Commission. The Commission may, by resolution, authorize the employment of such expert consultants and clerical assistance as its work requires."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
