BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the 1978 Wage and Salary Classification Study, the pay ranges for the following positions within the Fire Operations Bureau, Department of Public

Section 5. Section 5 of Public Law 15-136 is repealed.

"Section 7. The Bureau of Budget and Management
Research shall allocate the funds appropriated under Section

L. 15-117. This appropriation is available until funds are fully expended."

Section 8. Section 13 of Public Law 15-115 is amended to read:

"Section 13. The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the use of the Committee on Ways and Means to conduct a thorough study of the territorial tax system. The study shall be conducted under the auspices and supervision of the Ways and Means Committee. A detailed analysis of the study shall be submitted by the Committee on Ways and Means to the Legislature within fifteen (15) days after completion of the study but no later than September 30, 1981."

Section 9. Section 1968 (Public Law 15-128) of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 1968. The Commission shall prepare a proposed Territorial-Federal Relations Act which addresses immediate concerns on or before April 30, 1981."

Section 10. Section 17402 of the Government Code, as enacted in Public Law 15-100, is amended to read:

"Section 17402. Any permitted sign erected, displayed, or maintained pursuant to Section 17400 b. (1) and (2) of this Code which contains a message in a language other than English or Chamorro in Roman alphabet characters shall contain a meaningful translation in the English or Chamorro language which shall be printed on the sign using Roman alphabet characters. The Chamorro Language Commission shall assist in translating and approve all Chamorro translations required by this Section for existing and new signs. The English or Chamorro translation must predominate the sign."

Section 11. Section 65.17 of the Criminal Procedure Code is repealed.

Section 12. Section 2 of Public Law 15-94 is repealed.
Section 13. Subsection (6) is added to Section 130.20(a)

of the Criminal Procedure Code to read:

"Subsection (6). An order granting a motion to suppress evidence. This appeal may be taken prior to trial if the appeal is timely filed pursuant to Section 130.40 of the Criminal Procedure Code and before the trial has commenced. Upon the timely filing of an appeal pursuant to this subsection, the Superior Court shall stay all proceedings until the appellate court has acted pursuant to Section 130.60 of the Criminal Procedure Code."

Section 14. Section 8902 of the Government Code, as amended, is further amended to read:

"Section 8902. Identification card: required. No person shall own, possess, use, carry or acquire any firearm which is lawful under Section 8901.1 unless he shall have first obtained from the department an identification card evidencing his right to such ownership, possession, use or carrying, concealed or otherwise, as stated upon the face of the card; except that any person may use and possess a firearm at any shooting gallery licensed pursuant to Section 8901.3, et. seq., without first obtaining a permit as otherwise required by this Section. Said card shall be in the possession of the holder and on his person whenever he is using or has in his possession a firearm."

- "(b) Creating one or more funds or accounts into which all or any part of the revenue shall be deposited (i) for payment of the principal of and interest on bonds at or prior to maturity or (ii) for reserve or sinking funds for the further security of bonds. All moneys in any such fund or account shall be paid out by the trustee to pay the principal of and interest and premiums on the bonds when due or when redeemed or purchased prior to maturity, as provided in any indenture.
- Requiring the Authority to cause to be paid punctually the principal of and interest and premiums on the bonds on their due dates from funds in the account or accounts provided therefore."

Section 20. Section 53607.14 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read as follows:

"Section 53607.14. Trustee for Board and holders of bonds. (a) The Authority shall appoint a bank or trust company to act as trustee for the Board and the holders of the bonds issued hereunder, and the Board may authorize the trustee to act on behalf of the holders of the honds, or any stated percentage thereof, and to exercise and prosecute on behalf of the holders of the bonds such rights and remedies as may be available to the holders.
